#### 2023 COASC's Pickleball Slam FAQs

#### Q. Where does the money go?

A. All the funds raised will be utilized to provide support directly to the free programs and services provided by the Council on Aging – Southern California (COASC) to the 100,000 elderly and disabled adults we serve. We are excellent stewards of the money raised as 88% of each donation goes to the services and programs of our mission.

#### Q. Do I have to register to participate in the 2023 Pickleball Slam?

A. Yes, we need to know who is joining us as a player or spectator for our event and need every player or spectator to sign a standard liability waiver through their official registration.

#### Q. Is there a registration fee to participate?

A. Yes, there is a \$125.00 registration fee for each player or \$250 for a team of two. The spectator fee is \$30 per person.

#### Q. Is there an age requirement for players?

A. Yes, all players must be a minimum of 18 years old.

#### Q. How do I register?

A. To register online, please <u>click here</u>.

#### Q. Is there a registration deadline for players?

A. Yes, all players must be registered by June 20 to be entered to play.

#### Q. Can I register as an individual? As a team?

A. Yes, you can register as an individual and based upon your level of play you will be matched with another player.

Yes, you can register as a team of 2 players and provide each player's level of play.

#### Q. What category of players are in this tournament?

A. Women's, Men's and Mixed Doubles

#### Q. What do the terms Competitive and Fun & Friendly Flights mean?

A. There are two levels of play (Flights). The "competitive" flight is for players who are knowledgeable and have played for a while to a certain

skill level. The 'fun and friendly" flight allows for first time and beginners to be coached by a Club Pro and learn the basics of the game, how to serve and keystrokes. After the basics are understood this flight will play Round Robin games.

## Q. What are the Player levels of ability?

A. This is the individual player's self-assessment of their level of play for the Pickleball Slam:

a. I've never played before but looking forward to it!

b. I've played a few times and I think I know what to do.

c. I'm consistent with my serve and I know how to dink.

d. I play 4 times a week and win every game I play...sorry not sorry! 😊

#### Q. Where is the event location?

A. Our event is held at The Tennis and Pickleball Club at Newport Beach, 11 Clubhouse Drive, Newport Beach, CA 92660. Please see the map.

#### Q. What happens if it rains?

A. The event will be re-scheduled at a date provided by the Club & COASC.

#### Q. Are pets allowed at the event?

A. As much as we love our pets, sorry they are **NOT** allowed at the event. Only registered Service Dogs are permitted in the company of the person they serve.

#### Q. What is a team?

A. A team consists of 2 players. Companies can form as many 2 person teams as they wish to register. This is a great event to build co-worker fun and comradery while supporting a great cause.

#### Q. Why should I create/join a team?

A. Our 2023 Pickleball Slam is about community, and teams epitomize that concept. They are fun to participate in and to join.

# 2023 Pickleball Slam Day of Event

- 1. As a registered player you will receive a pre-event email.
  - The email instructions include a reminder of the date, time and location of our event site in addition to driving and parking instructions.
  - Confirmation on your level of play and your team partner's name.
  - Starting at 1:30 p.m. you will go to the Registration/Check in tables. There you will be able to check in, drop off any donations you may have and receive your court assignment.
  - Receive your wrist band for food and drink access.

#### Q. What do I need to bring to the event?

1. Wear comfortable shoes for outdoor court play.

2. Layer items of clothing. In California, the springtime weather can range from cold to very warm even at night (daylight savings time is in effect).

3. Wear sunscreen and/or a hat to protect you for a hot or sunny day.

4. Water is supplied at the event; it is a necessity that we are happy to provide. If you have a certain brand preference or need a sports drink, you will want to bring your own.

5. Your personal equipment, paddles, balls etc.
